- 2 Five, 10-day residencies, scheduled for January and June, in our new Lunder Arts Center in Cambridge, Massachusetts.
- 3 Each residency is separated by a 6-month semester of independent creative work and study in your own community.




THE RESIDENCY


Visiting Faculty

THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS

- Completed Application for Admission
- Official Transcripts
- Two Letters of Recommendation
- Resume/CV Reflecting on applicant's arts education, exhibitions, awards, publications, and relevant professional experience
- Portfolio of Work Uploaded to Slideroom. It is recommended that the portfolio reflects a consistent theme, project, or set of ideas
- 3-5 Page Written Statement Not meant to be a personal autobiography, this statement is a discussion of your work, its changes over time, and your artistic goals in an MFA program.

Priority deadlines to Apply:

For June residency and fall semester: **March 1st** applications will be reviewed in order received until May 1st

For January residency and spring semester: October 15th applications will be reviewed in order received until Dec 1st
